Open Source software, like Linux and Firefox, is both free of cost, and also free to *redistribute, share, reuse, and modify*.

In recent years, many resources have appeared on the Internet where you can find **open content and information** (books, graphics, sound, videos) that you can also use, share, build-upon and redistribute all freely and legally!

Wikimedia Foundation

Wikimedia is a non-profit charitable organization that operates online collaborative, wiki-based projects. (A *wiki* is a website that can be edited, often by anyone, directly from a web browser.)
